Air Travel Requirements - Beginning November 8

Following up on our email from last week regarding the new travel policy for <u>ALL</u> travelers entering the United States beginning on November 8, please see below additional details issued by the United States White House and CDC.

Please note, this policy affects all travelers regardless of what country you are coming from and is not limited to countries that were previously considered restricted.

We will continue to monitor for any additional information and will communicate any significant details we receive. Thank you for your attention.

U.S. Citizens, U.S. Nationals, Permanent Residents, and Immigrants

- Those who are fully vaccinated returning to the United States will be required to provide proof
 of vaccination and proof of a negative COVID-19 test result taken no longer than three calendar
 days of departure to the U.S.
- Those who are NOT fully vaccinated returning to the United States on or after Monday, November 8 - travelers will be required to provide proof of a negative COVID test within one (1) day prior to travel.

Foreign Nationals

- Those traveling back to the United States must provide (a) proof of vaccination and (b) proof of a negative COVID-19 test taken within three days of travel or proof of recovery from COVID-19.
- Those who are not fully vaccinated will not be permitted re-entry into the United States. The Policy allows for VERY limited exemptions. Please note that the PGA TOUR is NOT considered exempt from this policy.
- Any travel waiver/NIE received to enter the United States from a restricted country prior to November 8 will no longer be valid beginning on November 8.

Children (Under 18)

- Children between the ages of 2 and 17 who are not fully vaccinated may board a flight to the United States with a negative pre-departure COVID-19 viral test conducted on a specimen collected no more than 3 days before departure (i.e., Qualifying Test for Fully Vaccinated) if traveling accompanied by fully vaccinated parents or guardians.
- If traveling unaccompanied or if one or more of the parents or guardians accompanying the child is not fully vaccinated, the child must present a negative pre-departure COVID-19 viral test on a specimen collected no more than 1 day before departure. While children under 2 years of age are not required to get a test, CDC recommends a pre-departure test for these children whenever possible.
